Changes at Broadlands, Windfields, and York Mills CI

I have worked hard with staff to find ways to eliminate the Junior High model from the last two junior highs in the TDSB: Windfields and St. Andrews. Community consultations were held and staff have made their report as well, and all agreed to change Windfields and St. Andrews to offer grades 6-8 as of September 2018. This means that also that September, the elementary feeder schools including Broadlands will only offer Kindergarten to grade 5. Also, York Mills CI will become a grades 9-12. This is welcome news for students at Broadlands where there is significant over-enrolment, and for French Immersion students who are travelling from Dallington and Brian PS currently to Don Valley Middle School and then to Windfields for grade 9 before going to York Mills for the rest of high school. If this change is approved at board later this month, and I believe it will, it will mean those students will go directly from Don Valley Middle School to York Mills CI without having to spend 1 year at Windfields.

Remembrance Day

On Friday, November 11, students and staff at our school and across the city will mark Remembrance Day with classroom activities and school assemblies. During Remembrance Day, our teachers make connections between global events and students' lives by promoting peace within our school community. On this solemn occasion, our staff, students, parents, and the wider community all join together in a call for peace. I have been invited to lead the ceremony at 5050 Yonge Street for TDSB staff and am honoured to be a part of this solemn ceremony. This year's Remembrance Day marks the date and time when fighting stopped on November 11th at 11am in 1918 (the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month) which makes this the 98th anniversary for the end of the First World War. It is also the 71st anniversary of the end of World War II.
